
Welcome to the special St. Patrick's Day edition of the PPN Newsletter.












Sligo Concert Band Will Entertain the Gathering Crowds at the St Patrick's Day Parade Sligo Concert Band was founded in 1990 and so this is a special 30th anniversary year for us. We are planning our year which will include attending a band festival in Ballinasloe in May, a wide range of outdoor and street performances over the summer and a gala concert with guests and friends set for October. We are actively recruiting new members to join our friendly group and looking forward to linking with other bands in the western area in the coming year to learn from them and share experiences. We practice each Sunday morning from 10.30am–12.30pm in Summerhill College and also run a second practice to improve technique on Wednesday evenings from 7.30am to 9.00pm. Our Musical Director is Mr Don Swain from

Enniskillen, a flautist himself, who has many years experience teaching and who conducts a number of bands and choirs. Don has also joined the Sligo Academy of Music as a woodwind tutor. The Fermanagh link has seen us join with

bands such as Fermanagh Concert Band to play in venues in Northern Ireland like Castle Archdale forest park and St McCartin's Cathedral, Enniskillen. The band also joined Churchhill Silver Band for a performance at Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann when it was held in Sligo in 2015.

The Band's programme of events varies from year to year but has always featured a number of special events. These include Christmas Carols in the

Quayside Shopping Centre, Carol Services in local churches, an annual concert with guests, the National Day of Commemoration each July at Sligo City Hall and St Patrick's Day. We play beside the

reviewing stand for about an hour as the crowd gathers for the start of the parade. Naturally, our repertoire for

the day has an Irish flavour and includes pieces such as O'Carolan's

Concerto, Long Way to Tipperary, If You're Irish, The Green Flag and An Irish March Selection. We intersperse this with an eclectic collection of music to add variety and get the feet tapping: Obla Di Obla Da, Theme from Fame, Tuxedo Junction, Basin Street Blues, Liberty Bell by John Philip Sousa, Theme from Eye of the Tiger, New York New York, American Patrol and I got Rhythm. Our preparations of course include a good number of practice sessions but as to

other requirements, who knows. On St. Patrick's Day it can go from wearing sun screen to wringing the rainwater out of our music to dodging hailstones. Nothing will dampen the music though. And the good thing is that after we finish playing, there is still the parade to look forward to! What's not to

like?
