Sligo Cycling Campaign made an early start to the traditional March celebration of history and heritage. Rather than waiting for St Patrick's Day, we timed our event to coincide with the beginning of Seachtain na Gaeilge. On a gloriously sunny Saturday, March 5th, 16 participants set off on their bicycles from Mitchell Curley Park. Our Guide was Sligo County Council Architect, Seán Martin. The focus was not on traditional beauty spots but on the development of Sligo town and port as an important centre of Trade.

Our first stop was at the entrance to Rathellen House where we heard about Sligo County Council's application to An Bord Pleanala to develop housing on the site. The plan includes the restoration of the House and the construction of houses and apartments. We were delighted to hear it also includes provision for a segregated cycle lane, bus stops, <u>footpaths</u> and pedestrian crossings.

The second stop was to look at the Boundary Stone on the Finisklin Road. There are 14 of these markers on the roads around Sligo. Each is an old Irish mile, (2.04 km) from the Market Cross and they mark the old Borough Boundary. The cycle route was <u>in close proximity to</u> the Boundary Stones on the Ballydoogan Road, Strandhill Road and another Finisklin stone

Stop number 3 was at Ballast Quay where Seán told us about the gradual expansion of the Port and the development of new quays such as Ballast Quay and Lynn's Dock. The original port was at Martin's Quay where the Glasshouse hotel now stands but as ships got bigger, they needed deeper water and so new quays were built. We also heard about the iconic Batchelor's Building which is such a local landmark. When it was built in the early years of the 20th century it represented a cutting-edge building technique using mass concrete and steel in a way that allowed buildings to go up higher but still be strong. The building is a protected structure.

Our fourth stop was at Quay St car-park. Here we heard contrasting stories of the Great Famine. The sculpture of the family leaving for Canada is a poignant reminder of the emigration caused by the Famine. Across the harbour, we could see the stone wall running the length of Markievicz Road. The road and wall were built as a Famine Relief Works scheme. The pennies earned by the labourers allowed them to buy food and keep starvation at bay. The new road had a very practical purpose. Before it was built Bianconi's coaches heading North had to go via Holburn St and the Old Bundoran Road The road was too steep for the horses and so the passengers had to dismount and walk!

The group made its way from Quayside along the River to the final heritage stop at Sligo Gaol. There Seán told us about the hard work done by prisoners, breaking stones and operating the treadmill for pumping water up from the river. He explained about the different categories of prisoners. The people who were jailed because they were in debt experienced less severe conditions. Some well known prisoners who were interned in Sligo included Michael Davitt, Charles Stuart Parnell and Michael Collins.

Following this final stop, the cycle tour group made their way the short distance to Ripples Café at the Riverside Hotel. They were treated to very welcome coffee and scones and were entertained by Harmony Hill Quartet who sang in both Irish and English.

Sligo Cycling Campaign was very pleased to see old and new friends on the cycle tour. The bicycle was the perfect vehicle for the trip. Driving would have involved constant stop starting and the hassle of finding parking. Walking the route would have taken much longer and would have been more tiring. We hope to undertake some more cycle trips during the year!

#### Havin A Laugh

We Had A dream!

Since establishing the charity in 2015 the dream has always been to be able to provide a welcoming front door that anyone can walk through, at any time, to find the support we all need with our mental health. And now that dream has become a reality thanks to a new project called FLOURISH.

Flourish is a collaborative Mental Health project undertaken by Havin' a Laugh and supported by the HSE. It is a bridge between Mental Health services and supports and voluntary community organisations such as us. A centre <u>BY community FOR community</u>, a place to go where anyone is welcome to talk with trained volunteers, join an event/activity, visit the gardens or café, free of stigma and embarrassment. Flourish has been selected as a national pilot for a community-based service providing a safe and friendly environment for anyone, as an alternative to attending the Accident and Emergency Department of the hospital when in a state of mental health crisis. It has been designed to become a self-sustaining social enterprise, but for now, we need your help to get the Café, building and Gardens open to the public. We are fundraising to sustain us through our first year in operation. Your support will help us lay solid foundations to continue developing this community initiative long into the future.
