




Sligo Rivers Trust

Following a hugely successful public meeting on 20th September in the Sligo Park Hotel, the community of Sligo overwhelmingly voted to pursue the establishment of a Sligo Rivers Trust movement to protect the natural water sources of county Sligo

The event was collaboratively organised by the Rivers Trust, Local Authority Waters Programme (LAWPRO) and Sligo Public Participation Network (PPN). The aim was to introduce the concept of a Rivers Trust, how to go about establishing one and what a difference this kind of network can make to the protection of local water quality.

Bard of Connacht sought!

A new Bard of Connacht is being sought as part of the 40th annual Creggs Harvest Festival, with €1,000 in prizes up for grabs for the competition finalists.

The Bard of Connacht poetry competition is being organised by Kilbegnet Ballinakill Historical Society as part of the 40th annual Creggs Harvest Festival.

The competition aims to encourage aspiring and established poets to pen their thoughts on a topic of significance and be in with a chance to have their poetry adjudicated upon against the best poets in the region and perhaps be selected as one of four winners.

Creggs is a small village with big ideas on the Galway/Roscommon border but organisers of this year's Bard of Connacht have sworn independence and all poets who enter this competition are in with a chance of winning the Vincent Keaveny Memorial Trophy or one of four prizes ranging in value from €500 to €100.

The historical aspect of this year's Creggs Harvest Festival will focus on the 175th anniversary of the Famine of 1847 and its many repercussions on a local, national and international level. Local historian William Gacquin will give a talk on the Famine at an event in the Historical Centre in Creggs at 9 pm on Friday night, October 28th followed by a night of traditional music and dancing. A famine walk will also take place on Bank Holiday Sunday, October 31st in the vicinity of the Creggs area, demonstrating some aspects of the local heritage. With this in mind, organisers of the Bard of Connacht decided upon the Famine as the topic for this year's competition.

Poets are invited to submit one entry to bardofconnacht@gmail.com and all entries must be received by October 18th 2022 at 5 pm. A judging panel will then select the ten best entries, four of which will be winners. First prize is €500 and the Vincent Keaveny Memorial Trophy. Second prize is a Bard of Connacht Certificate and €250 and third and four prizes will also receive a certificate and €150 and €100 respectively. All entries must be original and there is no entry fee.

Composers of the ten best entries will be invited to attend an event in the Creggs NS on Bank Holiday Monday, October 31st and recite their poem and the five prize winners will be announced at that event and the prizes presented.

So it's time to put pen to paper on the subject of the Famine of 1847 and maybe you will win the title of Bard of Connacht 2022.

Sligo Field Club Journal, Volume 8, is about to go to press and will be available from mid-November onwards.

This volume will be a special one in that it recognises the tremendous work of Dr. Don C.F. Cotton who died in January. Nigel Monaghan has brought together from friends and colleagues a tribute article for him.

- The largest article this year is Don's detailed record of his work as Leitrim County Botanical Vice-Recorder.
- Still with nature Ian Sanders explains the metamorphic geology of the Ox Mts. south of Lough Gill.
- Cian Hogan, Marion Dowd and James Bonsall write of a chance discovery of several Mesolithic cherts found near the west end of Glencar Valley
- Padraig Meehan explains his thoughts on the internal duality within Carrowmore and within Carrowkeel passage tomb cemeteries, and then between Carrowmore and Carrowkeel, two linked by the Unshin River.
- Martin A. Timoney writes again about Knocknashammer, an imitative ferta and places that ferta a national context.
 Among the footnotes is the recognition, perhaps for the first time, of a secular cemetery of the 5th 7th centuries at Carrowmore. A ferta is where a tribe buried their dead at an ancient monument or what appeared to be an ancient monument.
- Mathew Seaver, Bernard Gilhooly and Linda Lynch show what was found in the excavation of a lintelled long cist grave Carrowgarry near Inishcrone and put it in a local and national context. The C14 date for the burial centres on 468 AD.
- Jim Higgins elaborates on the decorated high altar in Sligo Dominican Abbey, showing how much has been lost of the surroundings of that altar over the centuries. Following that Higgins and Martin A. Timoney identify some of the scattered parts of the altar that was in the south aisle of the Abbey, something not recognised before.
- Martin A. Timoney sets out what can be said so far about a sub-circular enclosure, hardly deserving of the late 17th century 'great fortification', though almost a kilometre in diameter, in Ballinafad and Bunadobber townlands. This enormous feature was not recognised until recent years. Its date lies somewhere between 1590 and 1620, and was probably associated with Ballinafad castle.
- John McKeon details the many phases of the building of Mullaghmore harbour and illustrates it with many 19th century maps and more recent photographs.
- William Gregory Wood-Martin was the colossus of Sligo antiquarian publication in the 19th century. Martin A. Timoney explains how Wood-Martin's life changed from 1874, lists his publication of nine books and how one led to the recognition of a crannóg near Nobber, Co. Meath. It corrects some comments published in a book recently about Wood-Martin and TerenceO'Rorke, the other major 19th-centuy Sligo antiquarian author.
- John Mullaney recalls memories of his youthful trips across the eastern part of Tireragh, reaching the Corragh Donn sea caves.
- Louise Keegan details the non-Sligo Field Club part of the life of her grandfather, Patrick Tohall, who was the founding Secretary of Sligo Antiquarian Society in 1945 which became Sligo Field Club the following year. Tohall survived WWI to make a huge contribution to Armagh and Tyrone history and then to Sligo and Leitrim archaeology, folklife and architecture.
- Jim Foran, in the Presidential for 2022, opens with 'the ongoing flow of events, unprecedented in our lifetimes. No sooner did the efforts to battle the Covid 19 pandemic achieve some success, than we witnessed large scale warfare in European for the first time since World War II.'
- The Editor looks at the passing of time and the passing of people, and he includes a time chart for Sligo that should help put our past in sequence.
- The articles are copiously illustrated in colour and extensive further reading lists are included the footnotes in many cases prompt further research
- This volume will be at least as big as last year's but will still cost only €25.Back numbers of SFCJ are available this would be a good time to complete your set, as the reserve stock of some are running low!

On a different them, may we say that Sligo Field Club faces practical challenges covering the costs of venues, lectures and publishing. Hazelwood Heritage Society Update

In 2006 our" Save Hazelwood" group was formed to campaign against a planning application to build a housing estate in the grounds of Hazelwood House. Planning was eventually denied, and we continued campaigning till in 2015 Mr. David Raethorne bought both the house and the old factory. Since then he has created a world class whiskey distillery and had done much conservation work to protect and restore the house. This summer Hazelwood Demesne including the House, grounds and the distillery was bought by the U.S, company Sazerac. They have plans to continue David's vision of restoring the house and also to develop the distillery still further. This is good news for Sligo both as a tourist destination and to provide employment.
