#### **Matt Molloy & John Carty**

MATT MOLLOY was born in Ballaghaderreen, County Roscommon and is considered one of the most brilliant Irish musicians and flutists in Irish music history. His numerous solo albums have been an inspiration to generations of aspiring flute players. He has been a member of some of the most influential and legendary musical groups including; The Bothy Band, Planxty and since 1979 he has toured the globe as a member of The Chieftains. Over the course of his career, Matt was named Traditional Musician of the Year by TG4 in Ireland. Molloy has worked with the Irish Chamber Orchestra, Paul Brady, Tommy Peoples, Donal Lunny, Sean Keane, Liam O'Flynn and many others. When not on tour, Matt owns one of the most famous music pubs in Ireland, Matt Molloy's in Westport in County Mayo.

JOHN CARTY: Born in London under the watchful eyes of Irish parents, fiddler John Carty has established himself among the elite in traditional music, and as a staunch supporter of its preservation. John Carty is one of Ireland's finest traditional musicians having been awarded the Irish Television station, TG4's Traditional Musician of the Year in 2003. Carty developed his love for fiddle, banjo, and flute — all of which he has mastered — through his multi-instrumentalist father, who was a member of the Glenside in the '60s. At the age of 16, Carty found himself playing in sessions with some of Irish music's finest, and began to entertain the thought of relocating to Ireland. Soon after settling in Boyle, County Roscommon, Carty released his 1996 debut, Last Night's Fun, to positive reviews. In 1997 he joined At the Racket — a fun, loose, free-spirited dance band named after an old Flanagan Brothers 78 rpm — which put out a self-titled record in 1998. In 2000 he teamed up with guitarist Arty McGlynn and began work on his sophomore release, Yeh, That's All It Is. His third record for Shanachie, At It Again, arrived in 2003.



18 young Sligo citizens came together at The Model in September to meet artists Geraldine O'Neill and Mick O'Dea, two of Ireland's most important portrait painters. Young people all over Sligo were invited to express their interest in having their portrait painted by the artists. The 18 young participants who are taking part are representing children from all kinds of backgrounds and reflect the breadth and diversity of Sligo's communities. In early November artist Mick O'Dea painted 12 of the portraits in action live sittings which were open to the public, family & friends of the children. Artist Geraldine O'Neill is working on the other six portraits in her studio in Dublin throughout next year. The finished paintings will be unveiled in a major exhibition at The Model in December 2023. The will become part of Sligo's municipal Niland Collection, where they will represent these children and their communities into the future.





#### Sligo Field Club Journal, Volume 8, 2022

Sligo Field Club began publishing an annual Journal in 2015 and has now reached its eight volume, which has been printed and will be available before the end of November.

This volume is a special one in that it recognises in several ways the tremendous work of Dr. Don C.F. Cotton, Sligo's outstanding naturalist, who died in January. This article was well advanced last Autumn but needed preparation for publishing. This was done by Dr. Tom Curtis and Dr. Maria Long in recent months. Botany, birdlife, insects, megafauna were all part of Don's life. The range of his knowledge can be seen in all our previous volumes. His map of peat along the Sligo coast is most important.

#### Other Items included:

- Metamorphic geology of the Ox Mts.
- Discovery of several Mesolithic cherts found near the west end of Glencar Valley
- Internal duality within Carrowmore and within Carrowkeel passage tomb cemeteries, and then between Carrowmore and Carrowkeel, two linked by the Unshin River.
- Knocknashammer, an imitative ferta, this time taking the site to a national context.
- The excavation of a lintelled long cist grave Carrowgarry near Inishcrone
- The rebuilt decorated high altar in Sligo Dominican Abbey,
- An almost circular enclosure, in Ballinafad and Bunadobber townlands
- A 1945 article on the Walsh family of Breeoge
- The many phases of the building of Mullaghmore harbour
- William Gregory Wood-Martin from his life from 1874
- Trips across the eastern part of Tireragh, Beltra to Aughris, and reaching the Corragh Donn sea caves
- Patrick Tohall, founding Secretary of Sligo Antiquarian Society in 1945 which became Sligo Field Club
