What is it?

The Power to Change Mentoring and Training Programme aims to work with and support 12 community group members of Sligo Public Participation Network to enhance the role they play in addressing climate disruption. This programme offers a unique and exciting opportunity for groups to review how they operate. Groups will work with mentors to review and improve how they operate from an environmental perspective.

What is the purpose of the programme?

The purpose of the programme is to build capacity within community groups to take positive actions to address the challenges of Climate Change. Community groups will engage in a range of activities over the course of 12 months including focus group sessions, dedicated workshops, and both group and individual training sessions. 





On April 29th the Neurology Support Centre will hold the "Surf and Swing" fundraiser in Strandhill Sligo.


This is a fun event where teams get to surf in the morning and golf in the evening while raising money and awareness for the NSC.



County Sligo Great War Memorial Garden Official Opening Ceremony

Lest Sligo Forgets (https://lestsligoforgets.org), in partnership with Sligo County Council, will host the official opening ceremony for the County Sligo Great War Memorial Garden at Cleveragh, Sligo town, on Friday 28 April at 12 noon.

Created more than a century after the ending of the war in 1918, the garden is a permanent memorial for County Sligo's 621 Great War dead, a place for quiet thought and reflection. It is a highly symbolic outcome of County Sligo's Decade of Centenaries programme given the nature of the shared histories of the peoples of Ireland and the difficult legacies of the past we continue to address as a community.

This important community-led initiative was made possible by public and community donations from around the world, financial support provided by the European Union PEACE IV Programme, Decade of Centenaries, and Royal British Legion in the Republic of Ireland, and significant contributions from Sligo County Council.

The opening ceremony itself will be a solemn affair with readings, musical pieces, and a short speech by the guest of honour, Mr. Tommy Gorman (retired journalist/ RTE correspondent), followed by the official opening.

The public is invited to attend this historic ceremony.
